Article Fifteen: Stewardship

God's Creation Mandate

We believe the universe and everything in it belong to God the Creator. God has entrusted the care of the earth to all people, who are responsible for managing its resources. Good stewardship uses the earth's abundance to meet human need, but resists the unjust exploitation of the earth and its peoples. All God's gifts are to be received with thanksgiving and used responsibly.

Responsible Living

To confess Jesus as Lord transforms values. Jesus warns that we cannot serve both God and wealth. Preoccupation with money and possessions, self-indulgent living, and eagerness to accumulate wealth for personal advantage are not in keeping with the teaching of Scripture.

Generous Giving

The Bible teaches cheerful, sacrificial, and proportional giving through the church in grateful response to God's goodness. Christians do not claim any of their possessions as their own, but manage all their resources, including money, time, abilities, and influence, in generous ways that give glory to God. They do not despise the poor but practice mutual aid within the church and share what they have with others in need. God's people seek to embrace a lifestyle of simplicity and contentment.

STARTING TUESDAY, APRIL 2, 2024, 6:30 - 8:30PM

There's lots of talk about being authentic in the Church, but not so much on HOW to develop it. Authenticity is a character issue and character qualities are developed indirectly. We don't set out to be humble, for example. Rather we learn to be honest about our strengths and weaknesses, shortcomings, etc. and we discipline ourselves to consider others as important as we are. Over time, humility develops. The same is true with authenticity.

Authentic Living will provide you with teaching, discussions, and "training exercises" that will produce an authentic life.

Authentic Living is an eight-week course that will take some effort – more than simply attending – that can change your life. A deeply formed spiritual life, a life of freedom and wholeness, takes both the miracle of God's grace and forgiveness and deliberate and focussed participation on our part.

Each week we will be spending time in Large Group worship and teaching, Small Group interactions, and On Your Own "lifework" assignments. Each Tuesday evening will begin at 6:30 pm and conclude around 8:30. Your "lifework" will take an investment of 1-2 hours per week on your own.

Course Topics:

WORKBOOKS are required for this course: \$25. Please Pre-Register by contacting the Church Office.

- 1. Learning to Hear God's Voice & Respond: engaging with Scripture with a listening heart and mind.
- 2. Establishing Priorities: discerning how God has created me in light of His purposes and ordering my life around that reality.
- 3. Traveling Light: living a repentant life, being honest with myself about my character defects, putting on the character of Christ.
- 4. Creating and Authentic Life Plan: mapping out how I will live out my calling and values with integrity.
- 5. Life Through Your Eyes and My Heart: learning to communicate well what is going on inside us, and how to process difficult relational events in our daily life.
- 6. Resolving Conflicts and Setting Boundaries: biblical conflictresolution, a model for resolving conflict; setting and maintaining relational boundaries. 7. Gratitude and Giving Back: sharing our stories of God's grace and transformation and thanking others for their contribution to our lives.

Each Tuesday evening you will spend about an hour in Small Group discussion. In week five, we take a break from the Large Group gathering, and enjoy an evening in Small Groups (assigned the first two weeks of the course).

Authentic Living is one way in which we will fulfill our vision:

We will pursue SPIRITUAL FORMATION that results in God-centred living, heart-level faith, and relational authenticity with God and others.
