# **Qualifications for Elders**

"The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. Therefore, an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, soberminded. self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not guarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil."

(1 Timothy 3:1–7, ESV)

"This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you— if anyone is above reproach, the husband of one wife, and his children are believers and not open to the charge of debauchery or insubordination. For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quicktempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, selfcontrolled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it."

(Titus 1:5–9, ESV)

## **Core Tasks of Elders**

"If you put these things before the brothers, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, being trained in the words of the faith and of the good doctrine that you have followed. Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths. Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance. For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe.

Command and teach these things. Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation, to teaching. Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophecy when the council of elders laid their hands on you. Practice these things, immerse yourself in them, so that all may see your progress. Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers."

# A Call to Prayer

The selection and appointing of leaders in the church is a call to prayer for the congregation. The first appointment of a leader in the book of Acts comes in a season of devoted prayer (Acts 1:14-15). Clear qualifications were determined (1:21-22). Two men met the qualifications, and then the congregation again prayed (1:24-25). And then a choice was made.

While the word "elder" or "deacon" is not used in Acts 6:1-7, we find a similar process in the selection of seven men to serve the needs of the congregation to free up the apostles to fulfill their calling of "prayer and the ministry of the word" (6:4). Again, the congregation was gathered, the need was presented, qualifications were clarified, and choices were made (6:2-5). The selection ends with the apostles praying for and commissioning the seven for their roles in leading and serving.

Prayer is needed from beginning to end.

# A Time of Discernment

Success in the business world, being well liked, good in front of people, age, or even being a ministry leader does not necessarily mean someone should serve as an Elder. We must discern from the biblical qualifications (1 Timothy 3:1-7, 4:6-16, and Titus 1:5-9) and the leading of the Holy Spirit, who among us should serve in this season.

# A Call to Participate

There is no one way to navigate the process of Elder Selection. Acts 6 has the Apostles handing the responsibility completely to the congregation. 1 Tim 3:1 indicates individual aspirations to Eldership. Paul instructs Titus to "appoint Elders", a rather top-down approach.

Gospel Chapel's process is between these three. We invite you, the congregation, to submit nominations. Then the Elders compile and consider submitted names. We contact nominees and invite them to consider the role. We publish the results allowing for a week for congregational concerns. At our February AGM, the congregation affirms the nominations and discerned final group brought forward by the current Council of Elders.

## A Call to Growth

For those who are nominated or willing to consider the role of Elder, we are calling men to a process of growth, discipleship, and discernment through a time of study, reflection, and mentorship for all potential Elders.

Guided by one of our current Elders, small groups of 3-4 will gather to examine their lives in relation to the qualifications and tasks of Elders.

Training on Board Functioning (biblically and legally as a Society Director) will also be required.

Elders must be Members of Gospel Chapel, in agreement with the CCMB Confession of Faith, and committed to the mission and vision of Gospel Chapel.

# A Process of Engagement

Elder Selection requires sufficient time for discernment, mentoring, and discipleship. This is a process of learning in relationship.

In September we will receive nominations from the congregation. From this we will invite many to join us from October-April to study the call, the role, and the responsibilities of Elders, and prayerfully consider the possibility of serving. Participating in this process does **NOT** mean acceptance of the call, or that one's name will stand for Eldership.

In this process, the individuals and the current Council of Elders must come to agreement on the future role one may take. The process will be thorough and, at times, "invasive" – we will be asking hard questions.

Our goal is to build into the lives of all current and potential Elders at Gospel Chapel so they can thrive as spiritual leaders in the church, at home, and at work.

Three Key Resources will be used as we pray, discern, and learn together:

- 1. The CCMB Confession of Faith with Commentary and Pastoral Application
- 2. Finding Faithful Elders and Deacons (Crossway, 2012).
- 3. A One Day Seminar: Serving as a Board Member: Practical Guidance for Directors of Christian Ministries by John Pellowe (Canadian Council of Christian Charities, 2012).

In March 2025, a final list of candidates will be considered by the Council of Elders and presented to the congregation in early April. Affirmation will be done at the AGM.

Through this whole process we ask you to pray for our Elders and those who are considering this call to serve. This is a serious and joyful matter.

"Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you."

## DID YOU KNOW?


